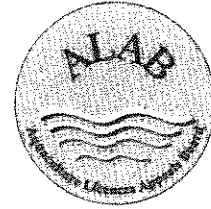

To Whom it may concern.

I have been farming oysters in Trabreaga Bay since 1991 and at this stage believe I have at least some knowledge of how to manage an oyster site in this bay.

To prevent a build up of sand our policy is to lay out the presties in double rows with the rows about 2 metres apart and a wide Road for the tractor between each double row

This has always minimised

the build up of sand to the extent that silting has never been a problem for us.

At the end of each growing season our policy is to lift and move all the trestles and this eliminates the problem entirely. We will continue with this successful strategy on all our sites and on any new sites we are granted.

We are therefore confident that using this plan silting will not be a problem.

We can assure you that there will be no sinking or burying of trestles on any site run by us as is the concern raised in Paragraph B. of Reason for Refusal.

We will not be "Subject to not infrequent sediment movements"

which is the concern raised in Paragraph A of the Refusal because this would indicate "bad site management and poor farming practice".

It is stated in Paragraph A that the "substrate is unsuitable with areas of uneven profile".

This is not the case with the sites we are now applying for.

These are T12/531A and T12/532A.

If we thought any of the concerns raised would become problems we would not be interested in applying for the sites.

I would like to ask what if any scientific study has been done to prove any of the concerns raised in Paragraphs A B OR C.
