- (a) The Board finds that the evidence presented in the AQUAFACT Report, along with the findings of the MERC Report do not allow them to rule out potential negative environmental and ecological impacts at, and adjacent to the Site. Due to the potential negative impacts of the proposed development on the sensitive species recorded in the vicinity of the Site, the Board finds that the Site is not suitable for the proposed development.
- (b) The Board found that the AA screenings carried out did not consider all the relevant SPA sites and the Special Protected Interest species which could be potentially impacted by the proposed development. Therefore, the Board finds that the-potential for significant negative impacts on Natura 2000 sites and species has not been ruled out at this time.

(c) The Board finds that the evidence presented in the AQUAFACT Report, and the findings of the MERC Report do not allow them to rule out potential negative environmental and ecological impacts at, and adjacent to the Site. Therefore, the Board finds that there is potential for significant ecological and environmental impacts on the area if the proposed development was to proceed.
