## Site Suitability Assessment

#### Site Location

The site is located within Crookhaven Harbour, Co. Cork. Crookhaven is a large sheltered picturesque harbour and a popular location for sailing. The proposed site is visible from the Schull to Crookhaven roadway (R591). This stretch of roadway is designated as a scenic route (S102) in the Cork County Development Plan 2014. The site is also adjacent to the high value scenic landscape.

## Proposed Site Layout and Site Management

The application is for the subtidal cultivation of scallops using cages located on the seabed. The applicant also intends to install 16 No. seaweed longlines for cultivating aquatic plants.

#### Land Based Facilities / Site Access

Site access is by boat from Crookhaven Pier.

#### Navigation

The proposed development is located parallel to the entrance channel into Crookhaven Harbour. The existing entrance channel is already relatively narrow for sailing and leisure crafts entering the harbour. I believe the proposed development restricts safe access into Crookhaven Harbour. In my opinion, bottom culture only should be licensed within the relevant site and not the proposed floating seaweed longline structures.

The MSO should be consulted regarding providing a safe system of navigation for all marine users.

#### **Visual Impact**

The adjacent stretch of roadway is designated as scenic routes (S102) and the site is also adjacent to high value scenic landscapes (Cork County Development Plan 2014). The roadway is also a part of the Wild Atlantic Way, a coastal tourism route along the west coast of Ireland.


There is currently no existing aquaculture activity in this area. In general, views of the seaweed longline site are obscured and limited from the scenic routes. There would be no visual impacts from bottom culture.

#### Impact / Cumulative Impact

There are fishing and marine leisure activities in the area. The proposed licence area is adjacent to significant marine leisure activities at Crookhaven Pier. The applicant has also submitted 2 No. aquaculture applications adjacent to the relevant application, site references T05/432A & T05/432C.

#### Recommendation:

I believe the proposed floating structures restrict safe access into Crookhaven Harbour and conflicts with the significant sailing and marine leisure related activities within the harbour. In my opinion, bottom culture only should be licensed within the relevant site and not the proposed floating seaweed longline structures.

### Site Suitability Assessment

#### Site Location

The development as proposed has the potential to conflict with the existing subsea pipe line identified below by Capt. Lawrence Kilbane and navigation in the relevant area.

A bottom culture method for cultivating scallops without the cage structures would be acceptable. No structures should be permitted within the proposed sites T05/432B and T05/432C.
